the <u>Canadian Teachers' Federation</u>, the <u>Ontario Federation of Labour</u>, and the <u>Ontario Teachers' Federation</u>. Being a proud voice for provincial, national, and international workers' rights binds us together with workers everywhere. This brings with it the power of solidarity in the face of oppression, and to our fight for better working and living conditions for all. This is what collective strength does—it changes the world and enhances the lives of all.

Teachers and education workers in Ontario have faced many challenges, including continued underfunding and underspending on publicly-funded education at all levels – from the early years through to post-secondary and adult education. We continue to work with allies and coalitions in other parts of the world to learn of and resist the threats of privatization in public education that are finding their way into the province. OSSTF/FEESO members have always come together to meet those challenges. This has made OSSTF/FEESO one of the strongest and most respected education unions in Canada and beyond.
