

Equity Update since September 2022

OSSTF/FEESO continues to be engaged in several activities as per the Action Plan to Support Equity, Anti-Racism, and Anti-Oppression. A few of the completed and ongoing actions are found below.

- The 2022-2023 Equity Advisory Work Group convened in October 2022.
- In October 2022, Starling Minds and Dr. Andrew Miki hosted a webinar for OSSTF/FEESO members to explore the different triggers and patterns that affect mental health and explored strategies that can be used to set limits to better manage mental health. A 6-week Mental Fitness Challenge that started on October 18th was introduced.
- In October 2022, OSSTF/FEESO sponsored a sector-wide symposium on inclusive education in Ontario public schools to explore issues related to special education inclusion policies and approaches. Participants included, education workers, teachers, school board decision makers, parents, and policy makers.
- In November 2022, The Educational Services Committee held their Educational Services Officer (ESO) regionals. The ESOs reviewed resources including the Canadian Black Lives & Canadian Women's Lives in addition to participating in a workshop that unpacked equity considerations for locals via an Idea Exchange.
- In November 2022, the Protective Services Committee Regionals will be leading members through a practical, hands-on workshop in how to complete an equity audit of their local collective agreement in preparation for local bargaining.
- OSSTF/FEESO increased the allocation of one (1) additional delegate spot to Districts for Lobby Day for Members from First Nations, Métis, Inuit and equityseeking groups to attend.
