During lengthy adjournments, an MPP will typically spend time working in their riding, on vacation, or a mixture of both.

Take 5-10 minutes over the break to ask them to explain why they supported, voted against, or abstained from voting this spring! Remember, Federation members can always find out how their MPP voted by accessing the Hansard – the official record of the Legislature.

Find the <u>current bill</u> you are interested in (Ex. <u>Bill 98</u>) \rightarrow Determine the day the vote took place (<u>Ex. June 8, 2023</u>) \rightarrow Review the Votes and Proceedings (available by month and day)


