	<p>Getting Started:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Select a woman of colour who has made an impact in Canada. . 		

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Identify the major and minor influences in her life (social, political, economic and cultural) and show with primary and secondary source evidence how she responded to them. • Pinpoint the turning point in her life. • Why and how did her work impact the surrounding community and Canada? • Take the perspective of the woman, how do you think she felt and thought about the work she was doing? Can you find evidence to support this? • Was she fighting against injustice? Research the injustice in Canada. Where are its roots? Who was supporting it? Who was fighting against it? Is it still an issue in Canada or communities within Canada today? <p>We will set up the classroom similar to speed dating and you will have a chance to interview each other in the role of the woman that you have researched.</p>
