

## **Equity Update since February 2024**

OSSTF/FEESO is deeply committed to equity, anti-racism and anti-oppression work so that our Federation, workplaces, and communities are equitable, inclusive, and accessible spaces. The Federation continues to be engaged in several activities as per the Action Plan to Support Equity, Anti-Racism, and Anti-Oppression. A few of the completed and ongoing actions are found below.

• Equal Pay Day in Ontario was recognized by the <u>Equal Pay Coalition (EPC)</u> on April 16, 2024. This date symbolizes the number of days women must work in order to make the same average wage as men. Although pay equity is the law in Ontario, women continue to earn almost 30% less than men on average. The coalition will be recognizing and highlighting different Equal Pay Day's for other groups of women through their social media accounts and website:

May 19<sup>th</sup> – Racialized Women
June 1<sup>st</sup> – Black and Indigenous Women
June 5<sup>th</sup> – Women with Disabilities
June 20<sup>th</sup> – Arab Women

- At AMPA 2024, a motion was passed to create a new OSSTF/FEESO standing committee, the 2SLGBTQIA+ Committee. The 2SLGBTQIA+ Committee will hold its first meeting in the 2024-2025 OSSTF/FEESO school year following the application process and appointment of members to the committee.

- The Protective Services Committee conference, We Are Protective Services –
   Defending and Supporting Members, was held from April 4 to April 5, 2024. Dr. Scot
   Wortley, Professor at the Centre of Criminology and Sociolegal Studies at the University
   of Toronto, was the keynote speaker for this event. Professor Wortley has led two major

investigations into possible racial bias within policing for both the Nova Scotia and Ontario Human Rights Commissions and contextualized the benefits of collecting race-based data as part of the Federation's data collection initiative to examine disparities in employer discipline.

 the Toronto Metropolitan University Student Centre.

Members who sit on OSSTF/FEESO standing committees and advisory work groups were offered an opportunity to request one of the ten complimentary tickets that was offered to the Federation.

OSSTF/FEESO's magazine, <u>Education Forum</u>, regularly accepts proposals from members, researchers, and community groups for articles related to education, labour, and solidarity. - In May 2024, OSSTF/FEESO will be sending a delegation, including one member from an OSSTF/FEESO standing committee, to the Coalition of Black Trade Unionists' (CBTU) 53<sup>rd</sup> International Convention. The theme for this year is, "Never Back, Always Forward: Hate Cannot Erase Us." The topics and speakers of the convention will address the victories that CBTU has experienced in 2023, and will also discuss the organizing needs for 2024 as a broader national and international labour movement. Reverend Terry L. Melvin, President of CBTU, was a guest speaker at OSSTF/FEESO's 2024 Annual Meeting of the Provincial Assembly (AMPA) in March.
- The Pride Toronto Street Fair will occur from Friday, June 28, until Sunday, June 30, 2024. In May, a D/BU memo will be issued with the details of the annual OSSTF/FEESO Information Booth and Toronto Pride Parade. Please visit <u>Pride Toronto</u> for more information.

• As a member of the Ontario Coalition for Better Child Care (OCBCC), OSSTF/FEESO attends all Annual General, Provincial Advisory Council and Board meetings of the Coalition. At the most recent meeting, the OCBCC provided a variety of updates including a status update on the Anti-Racism Working Group collaboration between the OCBCC and the Association of Early Childhood Educators Ontario (AECEO) where they reviewed the inclusive practices and policies that have been implemented since 2021 to support racialized educators and families.

Provincial funding is still available through account #2018 (Anti-Racism and Equity Training). Account #2016 (Anti-Racism and Equity Training for Members) has been exhausted for the 2023-2024 school year. Equity, anti-racism, and anti-oppression training applications for the 2024-2025 school year will start to be accepted on July 1, 2024.
